



***District Size Bias in Title I Weighted Grants:
Implications for Kentucky and the SE/SC Co-Op¹***

Since 2002, some of the federal funds provided to local school districts under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act have been distributed through “weighted” grant formulas intended to better target funding to districts with the highest concentrations of poverty. While this is a worthy purpose, these weighted grant formulas have also produced some perverse effects. Under the weighted grants:

- Support for a Title I student in a large school district can be greater than the support for a Title I student in a smaller district with the same poverty rate and the same cost of education.
- Support for a Title I student in a larger district with less poverty can be greater than the support for a Title I student in smaller district with more poverty.

These effects are caused by a provision in both the Targeted Grant Program and the Educational Finance Incentive Grant Program that weights the child count used to determine a school district’s share of the Title I funds. Under this provision, a district’s Title I student count can be calculated using either the percentage of students or the absolute number of children who are Title I eligible. The option of using the number weighting system rather than the percentage weighting system provides very large districts with higher per pupil benefits at the expense of all smaller districts.

The eligibility count does not determine a fixed amount of funding a district is entitled to receive. Instead, it determines the relative share of the funding ultimately appropriated by Congress that will be allocated to the district. Each increase in weighted count received by any district decreases the relative share available to other districts. It is a zero-sum game that favors very large districts.

The discrimination against smaller districts is apparent if you consider two districts with identical eligibility rates. Under the percentage system, the smaller district will receive the same amount per pupil as the larger district, because they both have the same percentage of eligible children, so they both get the same additional weighting. But under the number weighting system, the larger district, which has more absolute numbers of eligible children, will get far more funding per pupil because it will have children in the higher weight brackets while the smaller district will not. A small district with the identical percentage of eligible children as a larger district can – and does -- receive a smaller weighted eligibility count and a lower level of funding per pupil.

To demonstrate how the weighting system works, consider two districts in Kentucky: Jefferson County School District (19% poverty rate and an estimated 21,991 eligible children) and Corbin Independent School District (20% poverty rate and an estimated 370 eligible children).

Table 1 shows the results for these two districts using the weighting brackets based on **percentage** of formula children. With very similar poverty rates in these two districts, the weighting system yields very similar average net weights for each eligible. Corbin’s average net weight is slightly higher because its poverty rate is slightly higher. A student in poverty in Corbin is “worth” about 1.2 children in the eligibility count; a student in poverty in Jefferson County is “worth” about 1.1.

Table 2 shows how these districts fare using the weighting brackets based on the **number** of eligible children. Because there are nearly 22,000 eligible children in Jefferson County, some count as much as 2.5 times in the formula. In fact, over half Jefferson County’s eligible children actually count as *two and a half* children. When you add in this extra weight and sum it all up, every eligible Jefferson County student, on average, counts as 2.25 children.

By contrast, under this number weighting system, each eligible student in Corbin Independent would still only count as one student in the formula, because Corbin only has 370 eligible children, not enough to have any that are counted in the higher weight brackets.

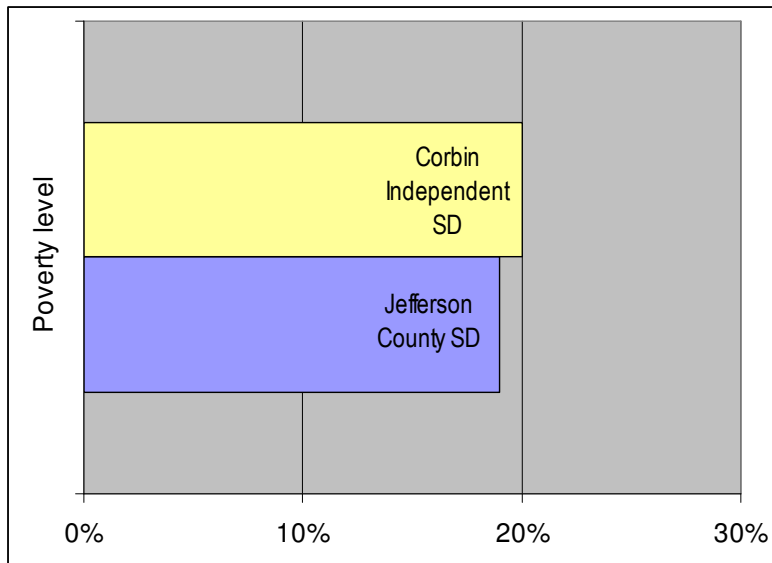
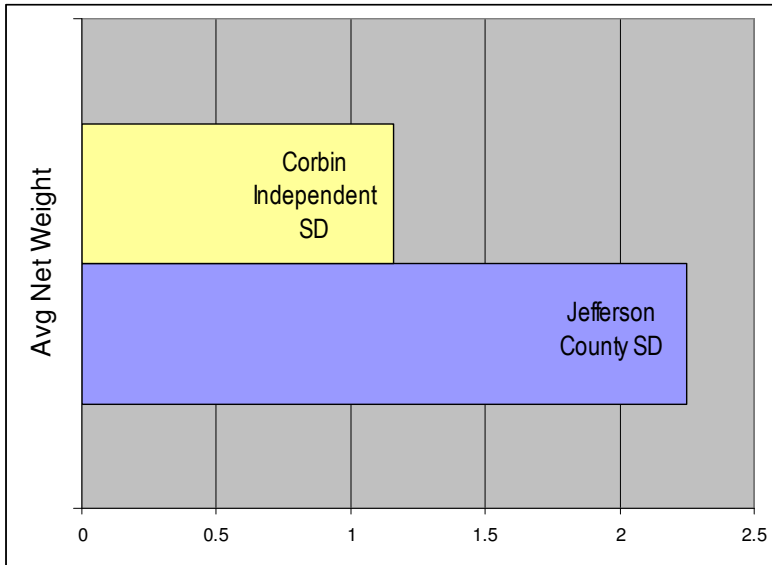


Figure 2: Net Weight of Title I Eligible Child: Corbin Independent v. Jefferson County

The weighting approach used in calculating each district’s Targeted grant is the weighting approach that gives that district the most money. And so, in the final count, Jefferson County gets credit for 2.25 times the actual number of eligible children using the number weighting system, while Corbin Independent gets credit for 1.16 times the number of formula children under the percentage weighting system. In other words, even though they contend with a slightly lower poverty rate, a Title I student in Jefferson County is worth almost twice the funding that a Title I student in Corbin Independent is worth (about 94% more), simply because Corbin Independent is a smaller district. See figures 1 and 2.

Figure 1. Poverty level: Corbin Independent v. Jefferson County

There are indisputably a lot more poor children in Jefferson County than there are in Corbin. But, there are a lot more places like Corbin in Kentucky than there are places like Jefferson County. Of the 81 Kentucky districts with poverty rates about the same as Jefferson County's (i.e., within 5 percentage points higher or lower), 61 have fewer than 4,000 children. These smaller districts average fewer than 2,000 children and are overwhelmingly rural. All together, they serve more than 22,000 Title I eligible children (just slightly more than are served by Jefferson County). These rural districts provide educational services on the same scale as Jefferson County to a population that is as needy as Jefferson County's, but receive about half the amount of money Jefferson County receives (\$3,215,971 versus \$6,655,795), simply because these districts are dispersed in rural areas.

Implications for SE/SC Co-Op Districts

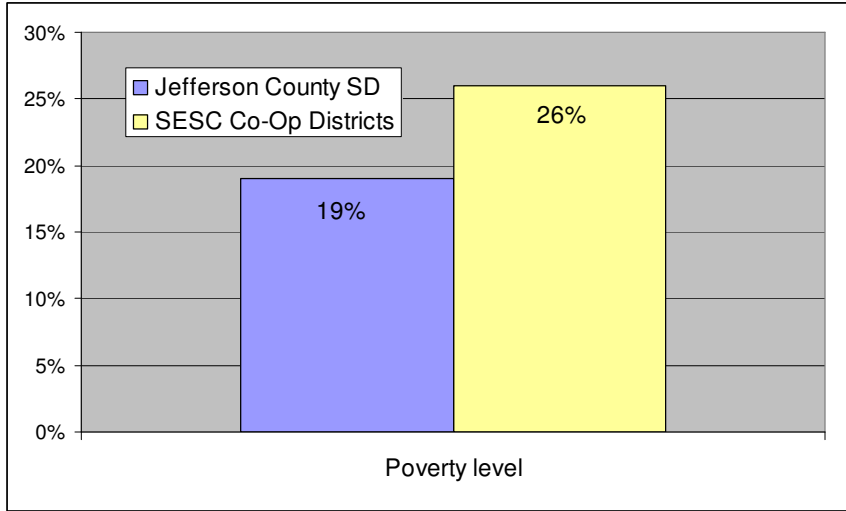
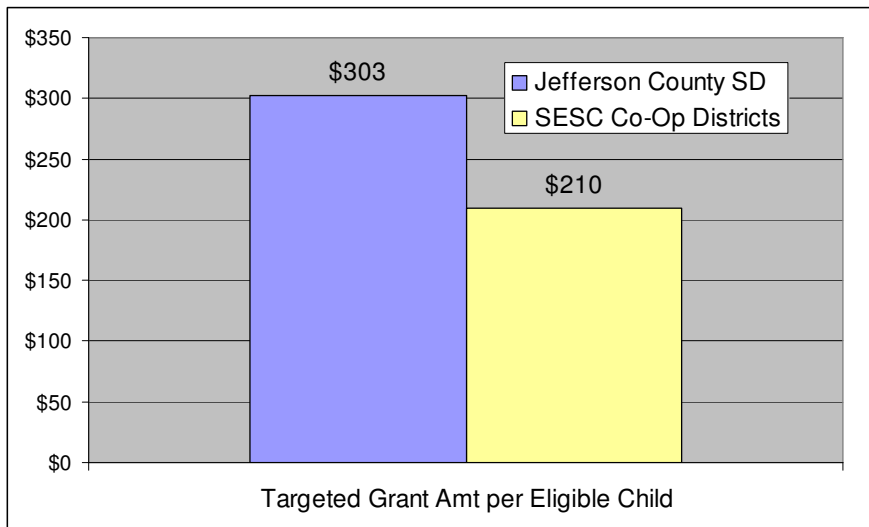


Figure 4: Targeted Grant Amount per Eligible Child: Jefferson County v. SESC Co-Op Districts

The 24 school districts in the Southeast /South-central Co-Op serve an estimated 72,288 children, of whom 18,653 (more than one in four) are Title 1 eligible. With 26% of all children meeting Title I eligibility requirements, these districts face poverty levels that are higher than the state as a whole, and considerably higher than Jefferson County at 19%. But while SESC districts face considerably higher levels of poverty than Jefferson County, their Title I Targeted Grant amount per pupil is \$96 per eligible student (32%) less. See figures 3 and 4.

Figure 3: Poverty level: Jefferson County v. SESC Co-Op Districts

Conclusion and Recommendations

The option of weighting student counts according to the number of children under the Targeted Grants and the Education Finance Incentive Grants skews Title I funds toward a few very large districts at the expense of all smaller districts. It has the effect of placing a greater value on the education of a Title I student in a large district than it places on the education of a Title I student in a smaller district with the same poverty rate. The simplest remedy is to eliminate the number weighting option and to weight all Title I children based on the district's percentage eligibility rate. If all districts are weighted by the percentage weighting system, the weighted grants will be targeted to districts with high poverty rates, regardless of the size of the district. A Title I eligible student will count the same in every district with the same eligibility rate.

Looking Ahead to 2008-09: Increase in Authorization Will Further Inequity

The FY 2008 federal education budget enacted as part of the reauthorization of NCLB included an increase of \$1.1 billion dollars in Title I funds (an 8% increase). The additional \$1.1 was split evenly between the Targeted and EFIG sub-grants, however—the two parts of the Title I formula using a complicated weighting system that is biased against small, mostly rural, districts (as described above).
